Mukhtafun in Egypt and in Syria today, Desaparecidos in Argentina and in Chile in the 1980s. A long thread ties the stories of generations of journalists, intellectuals, and political activists, whose only crime is doing their job in countries under authoritarian regimes: speaking truth to power. Focusing on the international solidarity movement, which emerged after the assassination of Giulio Regeni in Egypt, this conference brings together academics, journalists, trade unionists and political activists to discuss the intersection between human rights, academic freedom and the right to narrate. The contemporary challenges faced by the international civil society in the age of the “state of exception” to defend human rights and academic freedom, and to defend the right to narrate and to write history will be discussed from a diachronically and interdisciplinary perspective
