The deadline for registration is 15 June 2018.

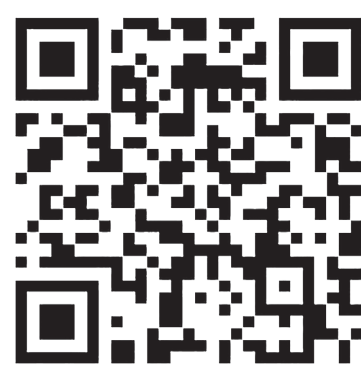
