The Italian text is the official text of the call for all legal intents and purposes and shall take precedence in the event of non-conformity with this document.

Who can apply

Application is open to all students enrolled in the following degree courses:

- 5-year postgraduate degree in Law;
- Legal Sciences for Firms and Institutions;
- Global Law and Transnational Legal Studies;
- Administrative and Juridical Science of Public and Private organizations;
- European Legal Studies.

Number of participants

The maximum number of participants is determined as follows:

- Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition: **5**;
- European Law Moot Court Competition: **4**;
- Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot: **6**.

How to apply

Applications must be submitted no later than **18/05/2022**, exclusively through the following [link](#). Late applications will not be considered.

Applicants shall list the three competitions offered by the University of Turin (Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition; European Law Moot Court Competition; Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot) in **order of preference**. Preferences will be taken into account in drafting the ranking list.

Applicants shall attach:

1. motivation letter;
2. CV;
3. self-certification of registration with exams “autocertificazione iscrizione e immatricolazione con esami”) downloadable from MyUniTo website;
4. copy of ID or passport.

All documents shall be in **PDF** format.

CV and motivation letter shall be drafted in the competition language:

- English for the Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition and the Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot;
- either English or French for the European Law Moot Court Competition.

Selection procedure and criteria

The selection is based on the documents uploaded by the applicant and on an

individual interview. Interviews will take place in the **Meeting Room in Campus Luigi Einaudi, Building D2, II floor at the following address: Lungo Dora Siena n. 100** on **01/06/2022, starting from 9:00 AM**. The interview will be conducted in English and/or French, depending on the competition(s).

The selection committee may consider the possibility of carrying out online interviews. Requests for online interviews must be made in the application form and will be granted only in exceptional and duly motivated cases. The time of the interview will be communicated directly to the candidate to the e-mail address provided in the online form.

The interview may include a short-written test of knowledge of the language of the competition and a verbal reasoning or summary exercise. The aim of the interview is to verify that the admission requirements have been met.

After the interviews, the selection committee shall establish a ranking list based on the following criteria:

- proficiency in the language of the competition (written and spoken) (up to 10/30);
- CV and weighted average of exams (up to 10/30);
- verbal reasoning and synthesis skills (up to 5/30);
- motivation and previous knowledge on the subject(s) the competition relates to (up to 5/30).

Only applicants achieving at least a **22/30** score will be included in the ranking list.

Acceptance

The ranking list will be published on the Department's website in the International Mobility Calls section.

Within 5 days from the publication of the results, the selected students shall confirm by email their acceptance to international.cle@unito.it. It is expected scrolling ranking after waiver or lack of confirmation by the winners to establish a final ranking in the 5-day period.

Obligations of selected students

Successful applicants will become part of the teams competing for the University of Turin in the three moot court competitions for the 2022/2023 academic year.

They undertake to participate in the relevant competition for its entire duration and with the utmost commitment.

They will be required, in particular, to draft written memoranda and, depending on the rules of each competition, to take part in the spoken phase.

Participation in the spoken phase

For each competition, **participation in any phase following the submission on the first memoranda is conditional upon an evaluation of performance** based on commitment shown and results achieved during the previous phases.

Scholarships

Only in the case the oral phase of the competition is held in person abroad, students participating in the oral phase will be awarded a scholarship, the amount of which shall be determined by the Department.

ECTS credits

The **whole competition** (written and spoken phase) is **9 ECTS credits** recognized: 6 credits from the International Moot Courts course (Prof. Alberto Oddenino) + 3 credits by way of seminar.
