Who can apply

Application is open to all students enrolled in the following degree courses:

- magistrale a ciclo unico in Giurisprudenza;
- Diritto per le imprese e le istituzioni;
- Scienze del diritto italiano ed europeo;
- Global Law and Transnational Legal Studies;
- Scienze amministrative e giuridiche delle organizzazioni pubbliche e private;
- Studi giuridici europei;
- European Legal Studies.

Number of participants

1

No more than **five** students will be selected for the Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition; no more than **four** for the European Law Moot Court Competition; no more than **six** for the Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot.

How to apply

Applications must be submitted by **29/04/2021**, exclusively through the following [link](#). Late applications will not be considered.

Applicants shall list the three competitions offered by the University of Turin (Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition; European Law Moot Court Competition; Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot) in **order of preference**. Preferences will be taken into account in drafting the ranking list.

Applicants shall attach:

1. a motivation letter;
2. a cv;
3. the declaration with exams and grades (“autocertificazione iscrizione e immatricolazione con esami”) downloadable from MyUnito;
4. copy of ID or passport.

All documents shall be in **PDF** format.

CV and motivation letter shall be drafted in the language of the competition:

- English for the Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition and the Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot;
- either English or French for the European Law Moot Court Competition.

Language certifications may be attached.

Selection committee and procedure

The selection is based on the documents uploaded by the applicant and on an individual interview. Interviews will take place **on the Webex Meetings platform** on **06/05/2021, starting from 14.00**. The interview shall be in English and/or French, depending on the competition(s) chosen. Applicants will receive the link to access the virtual room after the application deadline is expired and a few days in

advance of the interviews.

After completing the interviews, the selection committee shall establish a ranking list based on the following criteria:

- proficiency in the language of the competition (written and oral) (up to 10/30);
- cv and weighted average of exams (up to 10/30);
- motivation and previous knowledge on the subject(s) the competition relates to (up to 10/30).

Only applicants having reached at least **22/30** will be included in the ranking list.

Acceptance

Within 5 days from the publication of the results, selected students shall confirm their acceptance to international.cle@unito.it.

Obligations of selected students

Successful applicants will form the teams competing for the University of Turin in the three moot court competitions for the 2021/2022 academic year.

They undertake to participate in the relevant competition for its entire duration and with the utmost commitment.

They will be required, in particular, to draft written memoranda and, depending on the rules of each competition, prepare for the oral phase of the competition.

Participation in the oral phase

For each competition, **participation in the oral phase is conditional upon an assessment by the selection committee**, based on commitment shown and results achieved during the written phase.

Scholarships

Only in the case the oral phase of the competition is held in person abroad, students participating in the oral phase will be awarded a scholarship, the amount of which shall be determined by the Department.

ECTS credits

Participation in the **entire competition** (written and oral phase) is rewarded with **9 ECTS credits**: 6 credits from the International Moot Courts course (Prof. Alberto Oddenino) + 3 credits as seminar.

Students who have excelled in the competition will additionally be rewarded with one additional point (1/110) at graduation.
